### How the Mississippi Health Information Network (MS-HIN) can assist you in meeting Meaningful Use requirements

The charts below define Stage 1 & Stage 2 Meaningful Use objectives associated with the electronic exchange of patient health information and describe how MS-HIN services can assist eligible providers (EPs) in meeting Meaningful Use objectives. *Table A* addresses Stage 1 requirements and *Table B* addresses Stage 2 requirements.
